#### THE 2024 LEIPZIG BACHFEST AT A GLANCE

Entitled »CHORal TOTAL«, the 2024 Leipzig Bachfest celebrates two anniversaries: 500 years of Luther chorales and 300 years of Johann Sebastian Bach's cycle of chorale cantatas.

In 1524, Martin Luther published the first Protestant hymnbook in Wittenberg and in doing so laid the foundations for the grand tradition of Protestant chorales. Since then, generations of composers have used them as a springboard for experimentation, among them Johann Sebastian Bach: in his second year in Leipzig, the Thomaskantor chose the Lutheran chorale to be the musical DNA of his entire annual cycle of cantatas.

In 1724-25, Bach composed a good 50 cantatas based on well-known church hymns. At the 2024 Leipzig Bachfest, they will be performed in 16 concerts by 30 Bach choirs from five continents – artistic director Michael Maul's continuation of the concept behind the 2022 Leipzig Bachfest, which brought Bach ensembles, from amateur choirs to professional ensembles, to Leipzig from all over the world.

Also celebrating its 300th anniversary in 2024 is Bach's first Leipzig Passion oratorio, the *St. John Passion*. The Passion will be performed in three different formats: (1) a historically informed performance by the THOMANERCHOR Leipzig, conducted by the cantor of St. Thomas' Andreas Reize and with the same musical forces as at Bach's time, (2) a stage performance by the Bonn ensemble Vox Bona, and (3) at BachStage on Leipzig's Markt square, an admission-free and barrier-free version performed and simultaneously signed by the ensemble Sing & Sign, in which the audience is invited to sing along with the chorales. A total of 157 events are scheduled for this festival season in more than 30 venues in and around Leipzig.

The Leipzig Bachfest is funded by the City of Leipzig and the Ministry of Science, Culture and Tourism of the Free State of Saxony. The main sponsor of the Leipzig Bachfest is Sparkasse Leipzig.

#### **Ensembles and conductors**

Many of the best-known Bach interpreters will be performing at the Leipzig Bachfest, including ensembles such as the Amsterdam Baroque Orchestra & Choir conducted by Bach Medal laureate Ton Koopman, the Armida Quartet, Chorus Musicus Köln & Das Neue Orchester conducted by Christoph Spering, the Freiburger Barockorchester with Kristian Bezuidenhout and Neues Bachisches Collegium Musicum conducted by Bach Medal laureate Reinhard Goebel.

#### Soloists

Singing with the ensembles at the 2024 Leipzig Bachfest are soloists including Elvira Bill (alto), Hana Blažíková (soprano), Elisabeth Breuer (soprano), Alexander Chance (altus), Maarten Engeltjes (altus), Miriam Feuersinger (soprano), Bach Prize winner Patrick Grahl (tenor), Bach Prize winner Daniel Johannsen (tenor), Benedikt Kristjánsson (tenor), Tilman Lichdi (tenor), Bach Medal laureate Klaus Mertens (bass), Dorothee Mields (soprano), Alex Potter (altus), Bach Prize winner Benno Schachtner (altus), Matthias Winckhler (bass) and Hanna Zumsande (soprano).

Among the guest musicians performing in recitals and chamber music and organ concerts are the violinists Leonidas Kavakos and Hélène Schmitt, as well as Chouchane Siranossian, who as artist-in-residence can be heard in six Bachfest events, including the opening concert on 7 June with Alban Berg's Violin Concerto (To the memory of an angel). Further festival concerts feature harpsichordists Kit Armstrong, Kristian Bezuidenhout, Christine Schornsheim, Andreas Staier and Bach Prize winner Alexander von Heißen, guitarists Thibaut Garcia and Antoine Morinière and the pianist and Bach Prize winner Alexander Paley.

## Leipzig, the city of music

The THOMANERCHOR Leipzig and Leipzig Gewandhaus Orchestra traditionally perform at the festival's opening concert; the two ensembles will also be providing the musical accompaniment at the open-air church service on Leipzig's Markt square on 9 June. Leipzig's two composer houses Mendelssohn House and Schumann House, the MDR Children's Choir and MDR Symphony Orchestra and the Felix Mendelssohn Bartholdy University of Music and Theatre Leipzig also figure prominently in the festival programme with their own productions.

## **Festival highlights**

**The Apocalypse** – an unusual stage production by OPERA2DAY and the Nederlandse Bachvereniging based on choruses and arias by Bach – presents Johann Sebastian Bach, who never composed an opera himself, as a talented composer of musical drama. With the **Monteverdi Choir and members of the English Baroque Soloists**, Jonathan Sells will be turning his attention to Bach's motets in a double concert – in dialogue with Isabelle Faust, with her interpretation of Bach's *Sonatas and Partitas for solo violin*. This year, Bach's **St. Matthew Passion** will be performed by Václav Luks and Collegium 1704, while the **B Minor Mass** which concludes the festival can be heard on 16 June, sung by Collegium Vocale Gent under the direction of Philippe Herreweghe.

#### Bach research and panel discussions at the Bachfest

As every year, scholars from the **Bach Archive** and international guest speakers will be accompanying the Bachfest with free lectures, pre-concert talks and discussion panels, as well as the »BachSprechstunde« – a time for talking about Bach – and a seminar. Also during the festival, publishing house **Carus-Verlag** will organise a workshop for choir conductors with Ton Koopman.

IV. BachStage 2024

»BachStage« on Leipzig's Markt square on the opening weekend is an invitation to admission-free open-air concerts.

BachStage 2024 kicks off at 7pm on 7 June with vocal polyphony from Constantinople to Andalusia via Leipzig in a concert entitled **Voices and Memories**: the Babylon Orchestra, founded in 2016, is a Berlin-based fusion ensemble that combines European and Middle Eastern music with the sound of a big band and a contemporary orchestra. With the subsequent performance of a **barrier-free St. John Passion** at 9pm, Leipzig celebrates the 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the premiere of this epoch-making oratorio. In a sung and simultaneously signed version of this work, the Leipzig ensemble Sing & Sign will bring the emotions and experience of the music closer to the hearing impaired.

The second day of BachStage is devoted entirely to the theme of this year's festival, CHORal TOTAL. Kicking off the evening at 6pm on 8 June, Rudolf Lutz (keyboard) and a quartet from the J. S. Bach Foundation of St. Gallen will host a public choralesinging event: **Choral unlimited!** presents well-known chorales by Martin Luther, Martin Rinckart, Philipp Nicolai, Paul Gerhardt and Joachim Neander. Though half a millennium old, these hymns are still as fresh and atmospheric as ever – and have never ceased to inspire musicians to all kinds of musical experiments. The presenter is the Bachfest's artistic director, Prof. Dr. Michael Maul.

At 7.30pm, the Bach Collegium de Asunción and LeipJAZZig-Orkester conducted by Stephan König will be building whole new musical worlds with their jazz versions of Bach and chorales in **Choral Modal**. Starting at 9.15pm, **Bach goes Big Band** featuring the legendary hr-Bigband led by Jim McNeely concludes the second evening of BachStage with the gripping sound that results when Baroque austerity meets jazzy spontaneity.

IV. BachStage 2024

The final day of BachStage begins at 10am with an **open-air church service** in which the THOMANERCHOR Leipzig and the Gewandhaus Orchestra will be participating, conducted by Thomaskantor Andreas Reize. Representing the 30 or so Bach choirs from 13 different countries which are singing at the 2024 Bachfest, from 2pm on Market square three choirs will be introducing themselves in the aptly named **Bach-Chöre stellen sich vor** (»Bach choirs introduce themselves«) and performing excerpts from their repertoire spanning the early Baroque to the present. **The choirs are**: BachChor Tübingen, Bachchor Mannheim and the Bach Collegium Paris.

The evening programme on 9 June kicks off at 7pm with Inventions: Reinventions. In addition to all the popular two-voice *Inventions*, jazz pianist Dan Tepfer presents nine free improvisations in the »missing« keys, creating a new, complete cycle through all 24 keys. In doing so, the artist is following in the footsteps of one of the greatest improvisors of all times: Johann Sebastian Bach. In the project **Sampling Baroque: Bach**, Burak Özdemir and Musica Sequenza develop a new kind of music, free from ideologies, curious, sound-focused and going beyond the respective musical origins. In a meeting of Baroque and modern sounds, we will hear period instruments from the eighteenth century side by side with synthesizers and digital samples, promising musical forays into the unexplored world of electro-Baroque. Musica Sequenza led by Burak Özdemir (bassoon, electronics) concludes BachStage 2024 on 9 June, starting at 9.15pm.

With this programme, what began here four years ago with the slogan BACH – We are FAMILY!« – that is, transforming our annual Bachfest into the best-ever self-help group« for Bach fans from all over the world – is coming to a head. In short, I simply cannot wait for the upcoming Bachfest, and of one thing I am certain: no one will be able to resist the enchantment of the chorales, especially in Bach's incomparably polished arrangements!«

## Andreas Staier, laureate of the 2024 Bach Medal:

»My journeys to the city of Bach have always been something of a pilgrimage. I still clearly remember my first visit to Leipzig in September 1986, and how deeply moved I was when I entered St. Thomas' Church and laid a red rose on the tomb slab.

I had come on a trade fair visa, which at that time was the least bureaucratic way of coming into the country for someone like me, who had no relatives in the GDR. Christine Schornsheim, whose acquaintance I had made the previous year at the Stuttgart Bach Festival, had kindly offered to let me sleep on the pull-out sofa in her living room in Grünau. We undertook some unforgettable excursions in her Trabi, cheerfully and blithely ignoring the rule that forbade trade fair visitors from leaving the district of Leipzig.

That's a long time ago and much has happened in the meantime. But even now I approach Leipzig with the weak but eager steps of the pilgrim and hardly need emphasise how delighted I am, in this city especially, to be honoured with the Bach medal.«

VI. Awarding of the 2024 Bach Medal to Andreas Staier

The 2024 City of Leipzig Bach Medal goes to the harpsichordist and pianist Andreas Staier. The music of Johann Sebastian Bach has always been at the centre of his wide-ranging repertoire: Staier's interpretations of Bach's harpsichord concertos, the *Partitas*, the *Goldberg Variations* and both parts of the *Well-Tempered Clavier* are reference performances.

Andreas Staier's style of play attests not only a spiritual and intellectual understanding of the works, but also the gift of putting across his ideas in a magisterial and absolutely natural manner. The artist regularly performs on the concert platform both on the harpsichord and pianoforte, with ensembles such as the Freiburger Barockorchester, Concerto Köln and the Orquestra Barroca Casa da Música Porto. Staier was artist-in-residence at the international music centre AMUZ in Antwerp from 2012 to 2016 and from 2011 to 2021 at the Opéra de Dijon. For the past few years, the musician has also worked as a conductor and orchestra director.

On the occasion of the 2024 Leipzig Bachfest, the City of Leipzig Bach Medal will be awarded to Andreas Staier by the Deputy Mayor of Leipzig and Councillor for Finance, Torsten Bonew, and the director of the Bach Archive Prof. Dr. Dr. h. c. Peter Wollny, following a recital by the artist in the banqueting hall of Leipzig Old Town Hall on 14 June. Peter Wollny will also deliver the laudatory speech on the artist, who will play works by Jean-Henri D'Anglebert, Georg Muffat and Johann Sebastian Bach at 11.30am.

In recognition of their special services to the upholding of Bach's work, previous laureates of the City of Leipzig Bach Medal include the THOMANERCHOR Leipzig (2023), Sir András Schiff (2022), Prof. Dr. Hans-Joachim Schulze and Prof. Dr. Dr. h. c. mult. Christoph Wolff (2021), Angela Hewitt (2020), Prof. Dr. h. c. Robert Levin (2018), Masaaki Suzuki (2012), Herbert Blomstedt (2011), Philippe Herreweghe (2010), Nikolaus Harnoncourt † (2007), Prof. Dr. Ton Koopman (2006), Sir John Eliot Gardiner (2005), Helmuth Rilling (2004) and Gustav Leonhardt † (2003).

#### SPECIAL EXHIBITIONS IN THE BACH MUSEUM

### Voices of women from the Bach family

from 24 May to 10 November 2024

The world over, the name Bach is synonymous with Johann Sebastian Bach. But what do we know about the women of the famous family of musicians? About the court singer Anna Magdalena, the opera singer Cecilia, the teacher Christina Louisa or the sealing wax dealer Augusta Magdalena?

This special exhibition presents these women in four chapters: as family managers, singers, businesswomen and living together as a community. At different audio stations, 33 women raise their voices and tell us about their lives – from Bach's mother to his great-granddaughters. Valuable music manuscripts, letters, illustrations and documents provide insights into their everyday lives and their scope of action. Women's portraits from the collection of the conductor and harpsichordist Ton Koopman broaden the view to include European women stage artists, composers, music lovers and poets.

Numerous music samples provide an introduction to the repertoire of the female singers of the Bach family and their European colleagues. The special exhibition is part of this year's theme *Stark! Weibliche Lebenswelten in den Leipziger Musikmuseen* (Strong! Women's worlds in Leipzig's Music Museums). In exhibitions, guided tours, concerts and workshops, the Bach Museum, Mendelssohn House, Schumann House, the Grieg Meeting Place, the City History Museum and Musical Instruments Museum make the decisive role of women in the history of music visible and audible. All these institutions sincerely thank the Ostdeutsche Sparkasse Foundation and Sparkasse Leipzig for their generous support.

# Masterpieces on a weekly basis. Bach's Annual Cycle of Chorale Cantatas turns 300 Special exhibition in the Treasure Room starting on 4 June 2024

In June 1724, Johann Sebastian Bach began his largest, completed composition project: for 40 weeks, he composed nothing but chorale cantatas based on one fundamental musical and poetical idea. The consistency of the annual cycle of chorale cantatas is unparalleled. With it, Bach systematically achieved the »ultimate goal« of his life that he had formulated back in 1708 in his request for dismissal to

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the Mühlhausen town council: namely, to perform a »well-regulated church music to the glory of God«.

The special exhibition in the museum's Treasure Room presents selected "masterpieces on a weekly basis" and provides an introduction to topics such as hymns, chorale arrangements and cantata libretti.
