#### **LEIPZIG BACHFEST 2025 AT A GLANCE**

From 12 to 22 June, the Leipzig Bachfest will shed light on transformation processes in the work of Johann Sebastian Bach. Entitled »Transformation«, the programme, which for the first time encompasses over 200 events, is broader and more diverse than ever before, mixing traditional concerts with experimental and interdisciplinary formats. Even Bach himself will be appearing in person 24 times at the Bachfest.

Transformation, or change, is not only a key concept in current debate culture, it is also deeply anchored in Bach's music – in the Passions and in the *B Minor Mass*, as well as in the parody technique which set Bach's compositions in new contexts. Bach avidly studied the music of his European contemporaries to develop his own style.

The 2025 Leipzig Bachfest focuses on works Bach's works and compositions by others which Bach remodelled, as well as music in which he imitated and adapted different European styles. Similarly, numerous new and surprising concert formats reflect the festival motto of »Transformation«.

Bach's body of cantatas focuses sharply on the themes of transience, death and eternal life. Death is portrayed as a transformation process in which the faithful soul is awakened by Jesus in Paradise. In one special series of performances on cantatas for Sundays with biblical stories of raisings from the dead, the performers include Bach authorities such as Sir John Eliot Gardiner, Diego Fasolis, Leonardo Garcia Alarcón and Solomon's Knot in the churches of St. Thomas and St. Nicholas.

The 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Auerbach's Cellar will be marked in 2025 by a performance of *Bach's Faust*, a *Singspiel* adaptation of Goethe's drama with music by Bach. Moreover, the Leipzig Bachfest is inviting great thinkers of our time to discuss Bach's work. Augmented reality will be bringing Bach back to life virtually in the Leipzig Bach Museum, where he will recount episodes from his life while performing on the harpsichord.

The Leipzig Bachfest is funded by the City of Leipzig and the Ministry of Science, Culture and Tourism of the Free State of Saxony. The main sponsor of the Leipzig Bachfest is Sparkasse Leipzig.

## To die for: Death as a transformation process in Bach's cantatas

The themes of transience, dying, death and eternal life are recurrent in Bach's cantatas. This applies in particular to a series of cantatas which Bach composed for Sundays, the Bible readings for which tell of spectacular healings and raisings from the dead by Jesus. In accordance with Luther's exegesis, death here is not seen as the sad conclusion of a human life; instead, dying is portrayed as a rewarding process of transformation at the end of which Jesus will awaken the faithful soul in paradise. Bach set these words to music in unequalled fashion. In the interpretations by Bach experts Sir John Eliot Gardiner, Diego Fasolis, Leonardo Garcia Alarcón and Solomon's Knot, these cantatas can be heard as part of a cycle in the churches of St. Thomas and St. Nicholas.

#### Bach transformations in theatre and literature

The Leipzig restaurant *Auerbachs Keller* (Auerbach's Cellar), which Johann Wolfgang von Goethe once immortalised in Faust, Part I, celebrates its 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2025. With *Bach's Faust*, artistic director Michael Maul has written a *Singspiel* based on Goethe's drama, illustrated and commented on by Bach's music – and performed in the original venue with Burghart Klaußner in the role of Doctor Faustus.

At the invitation of the Leipzig Bachfest, great poets and thinkers of our time will be getting personally to grips with the elusive phenomenon of Johann Sebastian Bach. The About Bach series on 14 and 15 June features true literary virtuosi: Omri Boehm, Christoph Hein, Ian McEwan, Robert Schneider and Angela Steidele. The readings are held in association with Literaturhaus Leipzig e. V., the Konrad Adenauer Foundation and Leipzig University.

#### **Virtual Bach**

Starting this Bachfest, Johann Sebastian Bach will be introducing and performing regular lecture concerts in the historic Summer Hall of the Leipzig Bach Museum – thanks to augmented reality and funding from the film industry funding body, Mitteldeutsche Medienförderung. The age-60-plus composer plays the harpsichord while amusingly recounting scenes from his life, based on Bach's own, documented accounts.

#### Out and about with Bach: By boat, bike and tram

During the Bachfest, discover the city where Bach wrote the majority of his works – concerts on Leipzig's waterways and trams and a cycling tour with Bach by Bike take participants to well-known but also hidden places in Leipzig. In addition to this, guided tours by Leipzig Erleben GmbH give insights into the transformation of Leipzig, the city of music.

# Social transformation: innovative Climate Pass for the benefit of the Bach Forest

By introducing the Climate Pass, the festival organisers are giving visitors the opportunity to transform their own and the Bachfest's carbon footprint into something positive. Purchasing the pass funds the planting of more trees in the »Bach Forest«, the festival's central sustainability project which is unique among international festivals.

Three categories of Climate Pass are available: »Germany«, »Europe« and »World«, which take into account the individual travel routes, and therefore the different carbon footprints, of visitors travelling to the Bachfest. All proceeds from the sale of Climate Passes go towards the funding of saplings in the Bach Forest – 30 hectares of mixed woodland, created in 2020 close to a former mining area south of Leipzig, funded by the Bachfest.

#### Leipzig, the city of music

The THOMANERCHOR Leipzig and Leipzig Gewandhaus Orchestra traditionally perform at the festival's opening concert; the two ensembles will also be providing the musical accompaniment at an open-air church service on Leipzig's Markt square on 15 June. The THOMANERCHOR will furthermore present an acappella programme in St. Thomas' on 18 June. The two Leipzig composer houses, Mendelssohn House and Schumann House, the Leipzig Gewandhaus Choir, Youth Choir and Orchestra, the MDR Radio Choir, MDR Symphony Orchestra and Leipzig Opera, as well as the Felix Mendelssohn Bartholdy Conservatory of Music and Theatre in Leipzig, also figure prominently in the festival programme with their own productions.

Presented by Sparkasse Leipzig, the »BachStage« format on Leipzig's Markt square is an invitation to attend free open-air events with a VIP line-up on the opening weekend. »bach für uns«, presented by Leipziger Gruppe, promises children and their families some thrilling encounters with the music of the Bach family in eight concerts, plus one production by Leipzig Opera, in all kinds of different venues in Leipzig. With OpenStage in the central railway station, a grand piano from piano manufacturer Julius Blüthner Pianofortefabrik invites you to play works by Johann Sebastian Bach. ### Leipzig, a centre of Bach research

In 2025, the Leipzig Bach Archive celebrates the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its foundation. Once again this year, in-house scholars and international guest speakers will accompany the Bachfest with free lectures, pre-concert talks and discussion panels, as well as the *»BachSprechstunde«* – a time for talking about Bach – and a seminar. In honour of the anniversary, the Leipzig Bach Museum will be holding a special exhibition entitled *Breakthroughs in the Study of Bach*. In addition to this, gems from the Bach Archive collection will be on display in the museum's Treasury.

IV. BachStage 2025

»BachStage« on Leipzig's Markt square on the opening weekend invites you to free, open-air concerts.

The curtain will rise on BachStage at 6.30pm on Friday 13 June with a protest parade by local artists against global warming, entitled »2° sind zu viel. Be-Flügeln wir die Transformation« (literally »2° are too much. Let's give wings to transformation«). A grand piano (in German, Flügel means both »wings« and »grand piano«) will be part of the parade to illustrate the activists' intention – to highlight with music issues of transformation and climate change.

From 7pm, in its programme **Glocal Hits in Leipzig**, Bridges Kammerorchester will be giving a new voice to transcultural global hits: led by Harish Shankar, the ensemble will perform an impressive melting pot of global music tradition and know-how. Concluding the evening at 9pm is **The Arabian Passion**. The Ensemble Sarband combines Bach's work with today's political reality in the Middle East and takes a musical stand for peace and hope.

On Saturday 14 June starting at 7pm, the Stuttgarter Kammerorchester presents **Iron Maiden in Love with Vivaldi & Bach** – a thrilling fusion of Baroque hits and heavy metal that shows Vivaldi and Bach in a whole new light. At 9pm, the project **We All Love Bach** takes us back to the roots of Baroque performance practice. Linus Roth (violin), Aleksander Dębicz (piano) and the ensemble II Giardino d'Amore recreate Bach's timeless works in a lively and creative way.

The final day of BachStage, Sunday 15 June, kicks off at 10am with an **open-air service of worship on Leipzig's Markt square.** The music will be performed by the THOMANERCHOR Leipzig and the Leipzig Gewandhaus Orchestra, conducted by Thomaskantor Andreas Reize. In the evening, the Münchner Motettenchor takes the stage starting at 7pm and together with the Baroque in Blue jazz ensemble will present Bach's motets in a whole new, jazzy guise. From 9.15pm, the Paul Lay Trio will perform their programme, **Bach's Groove** – an inspiring tribute to the father of all music.

BachStage 2025 is presented by the Bachfest's main sponsor, Sparkasse Leipzig, as well as 50Hertz Transmission GmbH and others.

VI. Awarding of the 2025 Bach Medal to Marcel Ponseele

The 2025 City of Leipzig Bach Medal goes to the Belgian oboist, Marcel Ponseele. Thanks to this musician, new standards have been attained in the sound and manner of playing the Baroque oboe: besides his successful career as an oboist, Ponseele has also made a name for himself as an oboe maker.

Marcel Ponseele has been one of the leading interpreters on the Baroque oboe for more than four decades. With great technical mastery and unfailingly moving intonation, he has enthralled audiences in innumerable concert appearances all over the world. The same can be said of his participation in the Baroque orchestras of Ton Koopman, Philippe Herreweghe and Sir John Eliot Gardiner, as well as his performances with the ensemble II Gardellino, which Ponseele co-founded in 1988 and of which he is the artistic director. His interpretations of Johann Sebastian Bach's oboe solos in cantatas, Passions and concertos are important milestones in historical performance practice.

# BACH'S SONS. THE KULUKUNDIS COLLECTION Special exhibition in the Treasury

until 3 November 2025

For its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the Leipzig Bach Archive received the most valuable donation in its history: 130 autograph scores, letters and first editions from the Kulukundis Collection, worth around 10 million euros. Over nearly 70 years, the New York shipowner and musicologist Elias N. Kulukundis compiled the most important private collection on Bach's composer sons and their contemporaries, including Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart.

The special exhibition presents the life, work and influence of Bach's sons with the aid of key objects from the Kulukundis Collection and the museum's existing collection. At the same time, it provides deep insights into their musical education and their relationship with their father. For Wilhelm Friedemann (1710–1784), Carl Philipp Emanuel (1714–1788), Johann Christoph Friedrich (1732–1795) and Johann Christian Bach (1735–1782) it was certainly not easy to step out of the shadow of their genius father. Yet Johann Sebastian gave them the freedom to develop their own musical language.

How do we know when Bach composed his works? How do you find lost compositions? And how did Bach researchers in East and West Germany work together during the Cold War? The Bach Archive has been researching into the life, work and influence of Johann Sebastian Bach and his family for 75 years. The Bach Museum opened its doors to the public 40 years ago. This anniversary exhibition guides you through the thrilling world of Bach research: from the success story of the *Neue Bach-Ausgabe* to the pioneering methods of paper and document examination right through to the use of artificial intelligence in current research. Sound samples, media stations and interactive games invite visitors to delve deeper into the subject and to experiment.

Among the artefacts on display are valuable autographs by Bach and his sons, as well as an original punched-card system to determine the writer of the handwriting in question. A prologue of historical photos, letters and other items from the collection bring the atmosphere of the period of the founding of the Bach Archive, shortly after the creation of the GDR, to life. Telegrams, applications for business travel and factual reports recount the adverse circumstances under which Bach researchers in the East and West collaborated.
